School of Nursing at San Diego State University

Admission Criteria

Because the School of Nursing is an impacted program, enrollment is limited to a select number of students each semester who best meet the admission criteria established by the faculty. There is no waiting list or lottery system. Each semester the best qualified students are accepted. A point system is used for ranking and evaluating applicants. There are **77 POSSIBLE POINTS**. Previous applicants who were not accepted may “rollover” their application **ONE TIME** by filling out an Application Rollover Form. After that, students **MUST** reapply and show proof that they have additional points to strengthen their application. Successful applicants must meet the requirements below.

Note: Students who declared the pre-nursing major at a community college or university prior to the Fall 08 academic year will have the option as to which admission criteria they want to satisfy (assuming continuous enrollment). Please refer to the admission criteria outlined in your catalog the year you declared pre-nursing as a major (e.g. if you declared pre-nursing in the Fall 06 academic year you may elect to use the criteria outlined in your Fall 06 catalog). Please indicate your admission criteria preference on your application.

Proof of Acceptance to SDSU & Proof of Completion of SDSU Writing Competency

Minimum Overall GPA of 2.5 (52 Overall Grade Points Possible)

Successful Completion of the following Prerequisite Courses with a “B minus” or better letter grade (40 grade points possible)

Human Anatomy with Lab (BIO 212 – 4 units)

Human Physiology with Lab (BIO 261 – 4 units)

Microbiology with Lab (BIO 210 – 4 units)

Organic Chemistry (CHEM 102 – 5 units)

Points for the above courses are awarded as follows:

A = 10 Points

B = 7 Points

C = 0 Points

The following Prerequisite Courses, or their equivalents, must be completed with a grade of “C minus” or better (12 grade points possible)

Introduction to Psychology (PSY 101 – 3 units)

Introduction to Sociology (SOC 101 – 3 units)

Oral Communication – speech class (COM 103 – 3 units)

Points for the above three courses are awarded as follows:

A = 4 Points

B = 3 Points

C = 0 Points

Health Care Experience (10 Points Possible)

The School of Nursing allocates 10 points for applicants with 60 hours or more of volunteer or work experience in a clinical work setting.

Volunteer and work experience must involve direct patient care/interaction with patients. Volunteer and work experience hours can be accumulated from multiple locations, and can include volunteer hours performed during high school or anytime thereafter.

Documentation must be provided on the agency's letterhead before points will apply.

Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) Program Score (10 – 15 Points Possible)

Note: Applicants must score a minimum of 75% on the Program Score.
